



USCIS Updates Form I-918, Petition for U Nonimmigrant Status, Including Supplement B

USCIS has updated Form I-918, Petition for U Nonimmigrant Status, including Supplement B, U Nonimmigrant Status Certification. The new forms and instructions are at uscis.gov/i-918.

The new edition is dated 02/07/2017 at the lower left corner of each page. Until September 30, 2017, USCIS will accept the new edition or prior editions of Form I-918, including Supplement B. A signed Supplement B is normally valid for six months after a certifying agency signs it. However, beginning October 1, 2017, USCIS will accept only the 02/07/2017 edition of Form I-918, including Supplement B, even if the six month period from the date the form was signed is still in effect.
